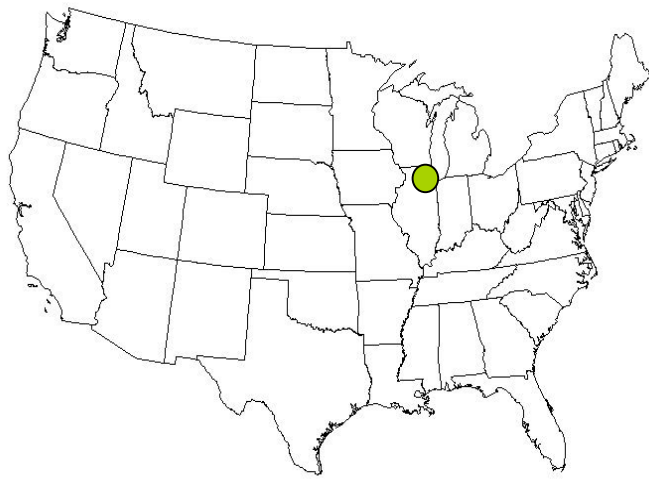


Chicago: The Windy City

About Chicago

The famous home to President-Elect Barack Obama, deep-dish pizza, the Oprah Winfrey show, and passionate sports fans (whether it's the Bears, Bulls, White Sox, or Cubs), Chicago is a **vibrant** city of 2.8 million residents.

After the city's great fire of 1871 – which some say started when a cow kicked over a lantern, though other theories exist – was extinguished after burning for nearly 30 hours, Chicago was immediately rebuilt and transformed to become the **bustling, thriving metropolis** that it is today.

Today, within its 237 miles, Chicago boasts 48 **cultural institutions, historical sites, and museums**, more than 200 **theaters**, and nearly 200 **art galleries**.

Situated on Lake Michigan, Chicago also has more than 22 miles of **lakefront bike paths** and 15 miles of **bathing beaches**, as well as 7,000 acres of **parkland**. From theaters and museums to recreation, Chicago holds endless possibilities for its locals to get out and enjoy life in the city.

Chicago, home to 12 Fortune 500 companies, has a **diverse economy**, based on **manufacturing, transportation, printing and publishing** (second only to New York), and even food processing (Chicago is considered the nation's "candy capital").

As one of the candidate host cities for the **2016 Olympics**, Chicago is proudly showing off to the world all that it has to offer, from diversity, to sports, to festivals, to arts and culture, to active environmentalism.

Lifestyle

Within Chicago's 77 community areas are more than **150 distinct neighborhoods**, each with their own personalities, from the South Side's urban lofts, to lakefront views in the Lincoln Park neighborhood, to single-family homes further out.

Chicago's diverse neighborhoods and suburbs are easily accessible via the Chicago Transit Authority's **buses and trains**, which comprise the nation's **second largest public transportation system** that serves more than 1.5 million Chicagoans daily. Hop on the elevated "L" train for a great view of the city in addition to an easy commute.

Also a center for higher education, the city of Chicago has **62 different college campuses**, including the top-ranked University of Chicago, making the city a **vibrant center of learning and research**.

Though Chicago's cost of living is higher than the rest of the country, it is still **lower** than that of other major cities like Los Angeles or New York City, making it an ideal choice for those who want to live in one of the greatest cities in America without paying a hefty premium.

Work for Chicago Schools

Chicago Public Schools: Reform Strategy

For two decades, Chicago Public Schools (CPS) has been on a **reform** path. Starting with **The School Reform Act of 1988**, which decentralized the district's power and empowered parents and community members, and continuing with **mayoral control** awarded to Mayor Richard Daley in **1995**, CPS continues to demand **accountability**.

In 2004, Mayor Daley launched **Renaissance 2010**, an ambitious plan to "create 100 high-performing schools in designated communities of need by 2010." By fall of 2008, CPS had opened 76 new schools and is on track to open 100 by 2010.

Chicago Public Schools: Leadership

In June 2001, Mayor Daley named **Arne Duncan** – formerly the district's Deputy Chief of Staff – Chief Executive Officer of the Chicago Public Schools. Duncan, a former Academic All-American and co-captain of Harvard University's basketball team, played professional basketball in Australia for four years before returning to Chicago to direct the Ariel Education Initiative, which seeks to create outstanding educational opportunities for inner-city children. In 1998, Duncan joined Chicago Public Schools.

Even today, Duncan uses his **basketball** skills to **reach students**, often playing games with them after he visits schools. An advocate of literacy, recruiting and retaining great teachers, strong after-school programs, and reducing the number of dropouts, Duncan is passionate about Chicago's students and seeing them succeed in school and in life.

The Chicago leadership team also includes a growing, **critical mass** of **Broad Residents**, with **15** currently serving CPS.

The hard work happening at CPS is having **results**. Recent gains include more than **65% of elementary students meeting or exceeding state standards**, and the number of high school students taking **AP classes** has more than **doubled** in the past five years.

While Chicago's reforms and results have drawn national attention for years, the spotlight is particularly bright now, when in December 2008, President-elect Barack Obama named Arne Duncan his choice for **United States Secretary of Education**, highlighting his desire to reform American schools.

For CPS, this appointment indicates a transition in district leadership, but with the district's **solid foundation** of reform as well as a **broad** and **deep** team of **change-agents** already working to transform Chicago Public Schools, the district's future holds as much promise as ever.
